- Implementing cost-effective enhancements.




The Program will ensure that the facility meets modern safety and efficiency standards. That way, we can bring you reliable services every holiday season and year round for many years to come!

### Be Conscious in the Kitchen this Holiday

Whether you're cooking or cleaning, resist the temptation to put grease or greasy foods down the sink. It can clog your pipes and cause problems at the sewage treatment plant.

Instead, put fat trimmings and leftover grease in a clear plastic bag. Then dispose of them in the yellow side of your FoodCycle cart. To keep them from making a mess, you can place those bags in the freezer until collection day. Bring large quantities of cooking oil to the [SMaRT Station](#) for recycling at no charge.



Remind your guests about the food scraps program before you start your holiday meal. Sunnyvale's FoodCycle program is unique – it collects more than fruits and vegetables. It also takes meats, bones, shells, eggs, pits, dairy products and even freezer-burned food from last year's feast.
